CACH Community Referral Program - Referral Types

- Community Referrals: These referrals come through our online Community Referral Survey.
- Agency Referrals: These referrals come from local agencies looking for assistance for their client(s).
- Self Referrals: These referrals come directly from an individual or household who needs assistance. These typically come through our Facebook page or website. Outreach Team Engagement: These are individuals our internal team notices or
- makes direct contact with without a referral.



CACH Community Referral Program

- 11 referrals were made to CACH and followed up on in the month of December.
 - Self Referrals: 18
 - Agency Referrals: 5
 - Outreach Referrals: 6
 - Community Referrals: 2

Bethel Night Shelter - Warming Season

• Bethel Shelters began its Warming Season on November 10th. During this season Bethel Shelter will be operating its overflow shelters to ensure men experiencing homelessness in our region have access to nightly shelter during the winter months.



LACH Warming Center

- The Lancaster Area Coalition for The Homeless (LACH) has opened its Warming Center, as of last night (12/4)
- The LACH Warming & Severe Weather Center is a short-term emergency shelter designed to provide a safe place to sleep, meals, and basic hygiene items in a clean environment on cold winter nights. The Center will open on nights where the temperature drops below 40 degrees or the weather is otherwise unsafe for individuals who are unhoused or unsheltered.

RAPID REHOUSING UPDATES

CACH Rapid ReHousing Program Stats

- Since starting our program in September...
 - Case managers attempted to make contact with <u>79</u> clients for onboarding.
 - **<u>69</u>** clients were contacted for onboarding.
 - \circ **<u>41</u>** clients completed onboarding and qualified for the program.
 - \circ **<u>31</u>** clients received application assistance and applied for housing.
 - <u>22</u> clients (21 households) transitioned into permanent housing.

2025 PIT COUNT DATA PRESENTATION

For York & Lancaster Counties



DISCLAIMER

Respondents: This count includes sheltered and unsheltered individuals and is based on the number of individuals surveyed who indicated they lacked permanent, stable housing. Our count includes doubled-up individuals (staying with a friend or family member) and individuals who were sleeping in a hotel/motel they paid for. These individuals are not considered "literally homeless" by the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and won't be included in the data compiled by our Continuum of Care (MACH).



DISCLAIMER

Accuracy: The data presented in this report is based on the individuals our staff, volunteers, or fellow service providers were able to make contact with over the span of a few days. Historically, the PIT Count under-represents the number of individuals experiencing homelessness within a community.

Clarification: The data points presented reflect the number of individuals who responded to the question, not the total number of people included in the count/survey.



<u>ACKNOWLEDGEMENT</u>

Each number and statistic detailed in this report signifies a human life. These individuals are integral members of our community, facing threats and hardships due to inadequate access to affordable housing. For every person counted, there are likely numerous others enduring the challenges of homelessness and housing instability within our community.



SURVEY TOOLS

Data was collected using the following tools:

2025 PIT Count Survey: This is the complete 2025 PIT Count Survey. In addition to the HUD-required survey questions, our team added a few questions to capture additional data on homelessness in our region.

2025 HMIS PIT Count Survey: This is a shortened version of the 2025 PIT Count Survey. This survey was used to survey individuals who stayed at an emergency shelter or transitional housing facility on the night of January 22nd.








INDIVIDUALS COUNTED

This year, we counted **291** individuals who were experiencing homelessness or housing instability. This is a nearly **<u>10% decrease</u>** from 2024.






HOMELESS CLASSIFICATION

Sheltered: Individuals staying in an emergency shelter, transitional home, in a hotel/motel paid for by a voucher, or in an institutional setting.


Unsheltered: Individuals staying outside, in their vehicle, or in a place not meant for human habitation,

At-Risk: Individuals staying with a friend/family member or in a hotel/motel they paid for themselves.










Survey Question: "Is this your first time experiencing homelessness?"









INDIVIDUALS COUNTED

This year, the Lancaster Area Coalition for the Homeless (LACH) counted **104** individuals who were experiencing homelessness or housing instability. This is a 35% increase from 2024.






HOMELESS CLASSIFICATION

Sheltered: Individuals staying in an emergency shelter, transitional home, in a hotel/motel paid for by a voucher, or in an institutional setting.


Unsheltered: Individuals staying outside, in their vehicle, or in a place not meant for human habitation,

At-Risk 40.4%





2 or More Races






FIRST-TIME HOMELESSNESS


TENDER HEARTS MINISTRIES
