- Workgroup overview
 - Jennifer Wilford provided an update about the workgroups roles and expectations. Each workgroup is required to meet at least once before the next CACH coalition meeting. The Chairperson for each workgroup will submit minutes to the CACH Executive Team which will be posted on the CACH website so that community members and stakeholders see the plans and hard work we're all doing together to tackle homelessness.
 - Beginning in March, the first item on the CACH agenda will be for each workgroup to network with the other workgroups to ensure the workgroups are COMMUNICATING, COLLABORATING, AND COORDINATING PLANS.

 - Each workgroups first assessment is to meet and develop measurable (SMART) goals, and objectives (milestones).

2021 Intake Trends:


- ~64% males, 36% females

- ~23% disclosed a physical disability
- ~18% disclosed a domestic violence history
- ~41% were currently staying in an emergency shelter
- ~56% were living in a place not meant for habitation
- ~55% disclosed no income
- ~17% disclosed income ranged between \$501 \$1000

Discussions

- Strengthen the coordinated entry system
 - Rev. Ronald King shared a concern with unsheltered homeless without identification. Pathways and 211 United Way discussed a collaboration to bridge the gap and see the HMIS "intake" will create an "ID card" for the individual. Alston Wilkes Society (Jo Ann Blackwell @Pathways) takes clients to the DMV and helps with identification paperwork (drivers licenses, ID cards, social security, birth certificates).
- Appoint CACH representatives from Lancaster, Chester, and Catawba Indian Nation
 - A question was asked about who CACH serves and the answer is the tri-county, however funding is specifically limited to Rock Hill
- CACH's 10 year strategic plan
 - The CACH Exec. team shared about the 10 year strategic plan that was derived in 2019 right before COVID.
 - The group agreed that we will use the plan as a framework but update it as needed based on relevant data from PIT count, and other data collection, along with the goals/objectives that come from the workgroups.
