
Rapid ReHousing: 12-month rental assistance program

- 33 households transitioned into housing since July 1st, 2025

DISCLAIMER



The information in this presentation is based on the number of individuals surveyed who indicated they lacked permanent, stable housing. Our count includes individuals who were staying with friends or family and those who were staying in a hotel or motel they paid for. While these situations reflect housing instability, these individuals are not considered “literally homeless” under the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) definition and will not be included in the data compiled by our Continuum of Care (MACH).

DISCLAIMER



The data presented in this report reflects the responses of individuals our staff, volunteers, and fellow service providers were able to make contact with over the span of a few days. Historically, Point-in-Time (PIT) Counts under-represent the number of individuals experiencing homelessness within a community.

SURVEY TOOLS



Data was collected using the following tools:

- **2026 PIT Count Survey:** Full survey with HUD-required questions + additional local questions
- **2026 PIT Count Shelter Survey:** Shortened survey used for emergency shelter and transitional housing guests
- **Homeless Management Information System (HMIS):** Used to pull additional demographic data for shelter and transitional housing guests




Each number and statistic included in this report represents a human life. These individuals are integral members of our community and are facing significant hardship due to limited access to safe, affordable housing. For every person counted, there are likely many others in our community who are also experiencing homelessness or housing instability.

INDIVIDUALS COUNTED



This year, we counted 268 individuals who were experiencing homelessness or housing instability. This is a nearly 8.6% decrease from 2025 and a 20.5% decrease from 2024.




HOMELESS CLASSIFICATION



Sheltered: Individuals staying in an emergency shelter, transitional home, in a hotel/motel paid for by a voucher, or in an institutional setting.

Unsheltered: Individuals staying outside, in their vehicle, or in a place not meant for human habitation,


At-Risk: Individuals staying with a friend/family member or in a hotel/motel they paid for themselves.



CHANGE FROM PREVIOUS YEARS













WHAT IS YOUR EMPLOYMENT STATUS

Labor Force Participation Rate




Of those not participating in the Labor Force, 74% reported being retired, disabled, or a student.


% OF THOSE ON A FIXED INCOME




**WHICH OF THE FOLLOWING

Number of Contributing Factors Per Respondent




Reported Contributing Factors



WHAT IS THE COUNTY OF YOUR LAST PERMANENT ADDRESS?


