CACH Community Referral Program — Referral Types

- Community Referrals: These referrals come through our online Community Referral Survey.
- **Agency Referrals:** These referrals come from local agencies looking for assistance for their client(s).
- **Self Referrals**: These referrals come directly from an individual or household who needs assistance. These typically come through our Facebook page or website.
- Outreach Team Engagement: These are individuals our internal team notices or makes direct contact with without a referral.



CACH Community Referral Program: In the month of May, CACH's Outreach Team followed-up on 32 referrals.

- Self Referrals: 20
- Agency Referrals: 9
- Outreach Referrals: 3
- Community Referrals: 0

RAPID REHOUSING UPDATES

We have officially concluded onboarding for the 2024–2025 funding cycle and plan to begin enrolling new participants closer to the fall.

During this funding cycle, <u>25 clients</u> from the Coordinated Entry List successfully transitioned from homelessness into permanent housing. The program is currently serving <u>47 individuals</u>, including 19 children.



WHAT IS CORRDINATED ENTRY?

The Coordinated Entry System (CES) is...

- A streamlined process for assessing, prioritizing, and connecting individuals experiencing homelessness to available housing and services.
- Designed to ensure fairness, transparency, and efficiency in how people access resources.



HOW DOES CES WORK?

During the Coordinated Entry process, agencies work to...

- Identify individuals and families who are in a housing crisis.
- <u>Assess</u> each person's unique circumstances and needs to better understand how to support them.
- <u>Prioritize</u> individuals based on their assessment and match them with programs according to their level of need.
- Refer individuals to available services that address their immediate needs and help reduce barriers to housing.



WHO PARTICIPATES IN CES?

The success of the Coordinated Entry System depends on collaboration among diverse service providers who help assess, refer, support, and house individuals and families in need.

Key Coordinated Entry partners include organizations or locations (Access Points) where individuals and families experiencing homelessness can begin the Coordinated Entry process. These agencies complete initial assessments, gather required documentation, and help refer clients into the system.



WHO PARTICIPATES IN CES?

Currently, eight local agencies serve as Coordinated Entry Access Points:

- Bethel Shelters
- CACH (Street Outreach Team)
- Family Promise of York County
- The Haven Men's Shelter
- The Life House Women's Shelter
- Pathways Community Center
- Pilgrims' Inn
- United Way of Lancaster County



WHO IS INCLUDED IN CES?

While many individuals and families in our region are in need of stable housing and supportive services, they are only included on our community's CES List (also known as a By-Name List or Prioritization List) if they meet all of the following criteria:

- Meet HUD's definition of literal homelessness
- Are entered into the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS)
- Have a complete and up-to-date Coordinated Entry Assessment (also referred to as a Vulnerability Assessment or VI-SPDAT)



WHAT DATA DO WE TRACK?


Currently, our organization is tracking the following data points:

- Total individuals on the CES List
- Sleep location (e.g., unsheltered, sheltered, or institutional setting)
- Entries into the homeless response system
- Exits from the homeless response system
- Exit destinations (e.g., permanent housing, temporary arrangements, unknown, etc.)





TOTAL CLIENTS (MARCH - MAY)






SLEEP LOCATION (MAY)






ENTRIES & EXITS (MAY)

HOW CAN THIS DATA HELP?

Data collected and tracked through the Coordinated Entry System helps us measure the effectiveness of our homeless response system. We use this data to:

- Monitor housing placements and referral timeliness
- Evaluate program accessibility across populations
- Identify under-served regions, populations, and gaps in services
- Make continuous improvements to our homeless response system



WHAT'S NEXT?

In an effort to strengthen our homeless response system, we are working to...

- Improve the quality of data collected through the CES system
- Improve feedback loops between CES data and partner agencies
- Expand community access to CES data through regular updates and/or data dashboards




