OUTREACH UPDATES



Important Update: The York County Public Library closed on Saturday, September 29, for necessary repairs. The project is expected to take approximately six months. During this time, the library will remain closed to the public.

OPERATIONS UPDATES



Volunteer Management: In partnership with York County's COAD (Communities Active in Disaster), we are working alongside shelter partners, service providers, and volunteers throughout York County to strengthen preparedness and ensure an effective response in the event of a disaster.

If your agency anticipates needing additional volunteers during a disaster, we encourage you to create a free nonprofit account in **POINT**. This platform will allow York County COAD to directly connect community members who want to help with agencies that need support. To set up your account, visit www.pointapp.org.

Free accounts are limited, so we encourage you to create yours as soon as possible.

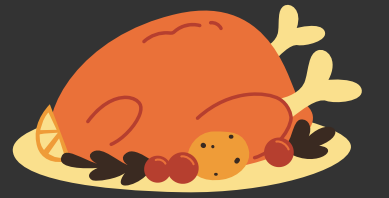

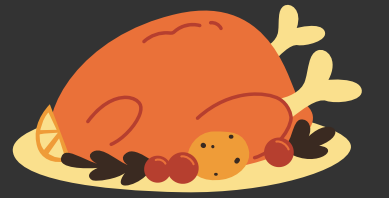

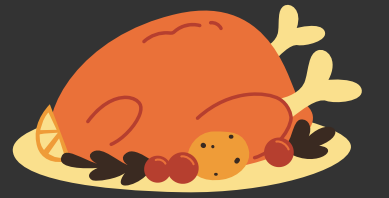

HMIS New Data Standards: HUD has released updated Data Standards. If you are an HMIS user, you will receive an email with details about attending a mandatory training on these new standards. Multiple 30-minute sessions will be offered next week. HMIS users are only required to attend one training.

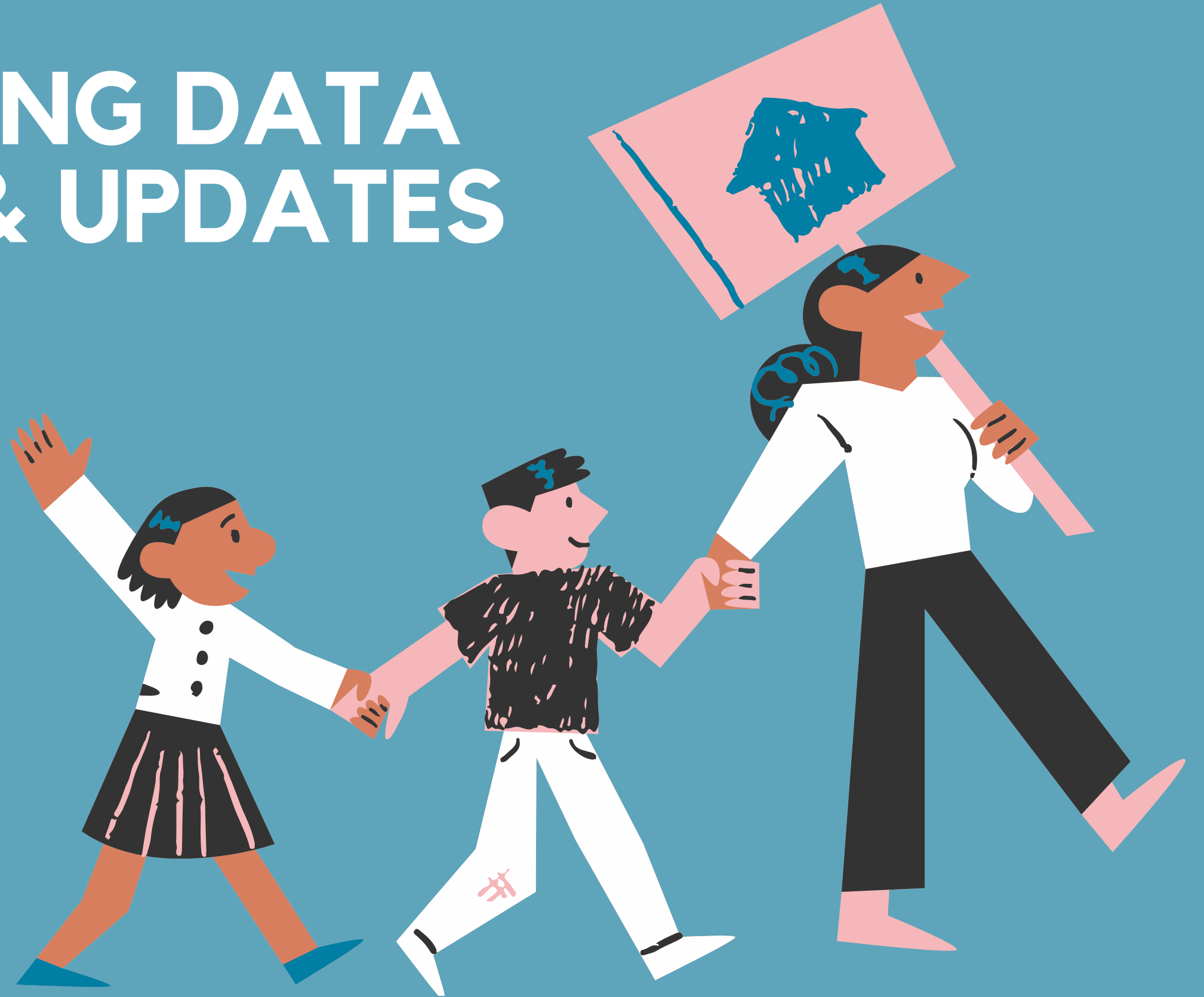
LSA (Longitudinal System Analysis) Report: If your agency uses HMIS and provides emergency shelter, transitional housing, or Rapid ReHousing services, Erin will be sending out data quality errors that must be corrected for this report.

CoC NOFO Update: HUD has notified Continuums of Care (CoCs) that a CoC Program Competition will be held in 2025, but the NOFO has not yet been released.

RRH IMPACT (20 — 24/25).



From 2020 through the 2024—2025 fiscal year, the Housing Development Corporation of Rock Hill (HDC) and the Catawba Area Coalition for the Homeless (CACH) served a combined:

- 52 households
- 110 individuals (63 adults, 47 children)

25-26 RRH UPDATES (HDC & CACH).



Rapid ReHousing: 12-month rental assistance program (Chester, Lancaster, & York)

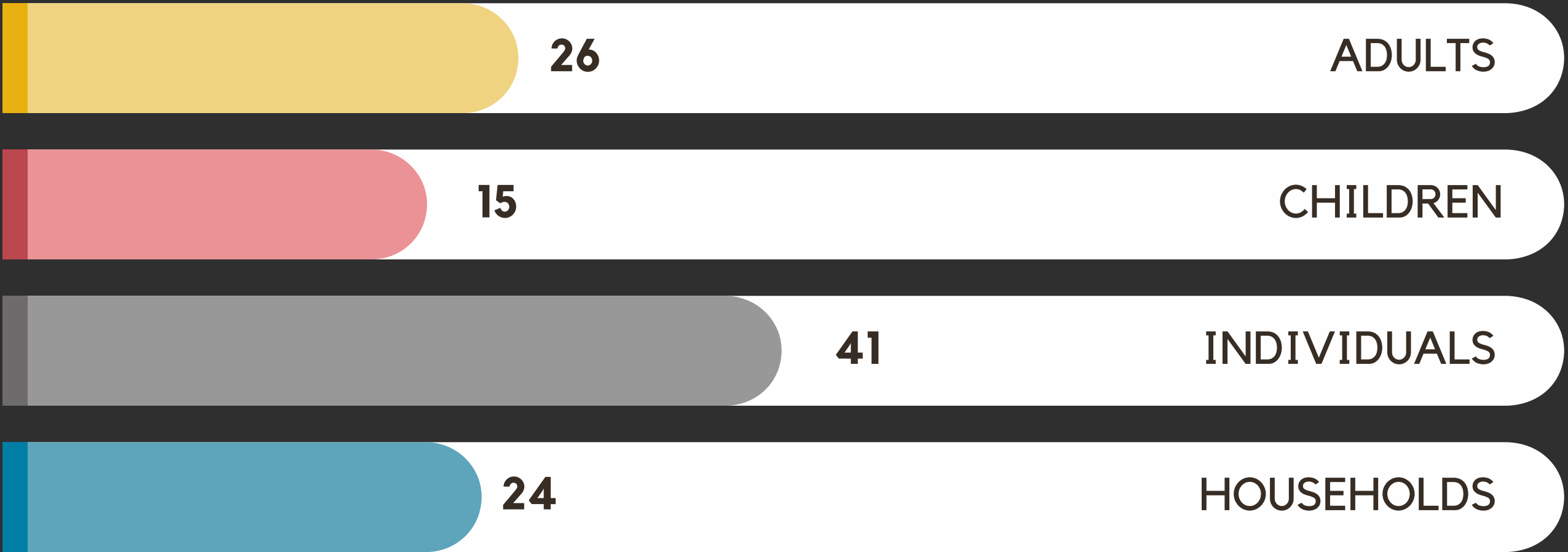
- 31 households onboarded
- 14 households transitioned into housing

Rapid Reset: Moving assistance program (Chester & York)

- 32 households completed applications
- 10 households transitioned into housing

Average Individuals Served (Past 5 Years): 22 individuals housed per year

Current FY Year-to-Date (First 3 Months): 41 individuals already housed

- Nearly double the 5-year annual average
- Achieved in just a quarter of the time
