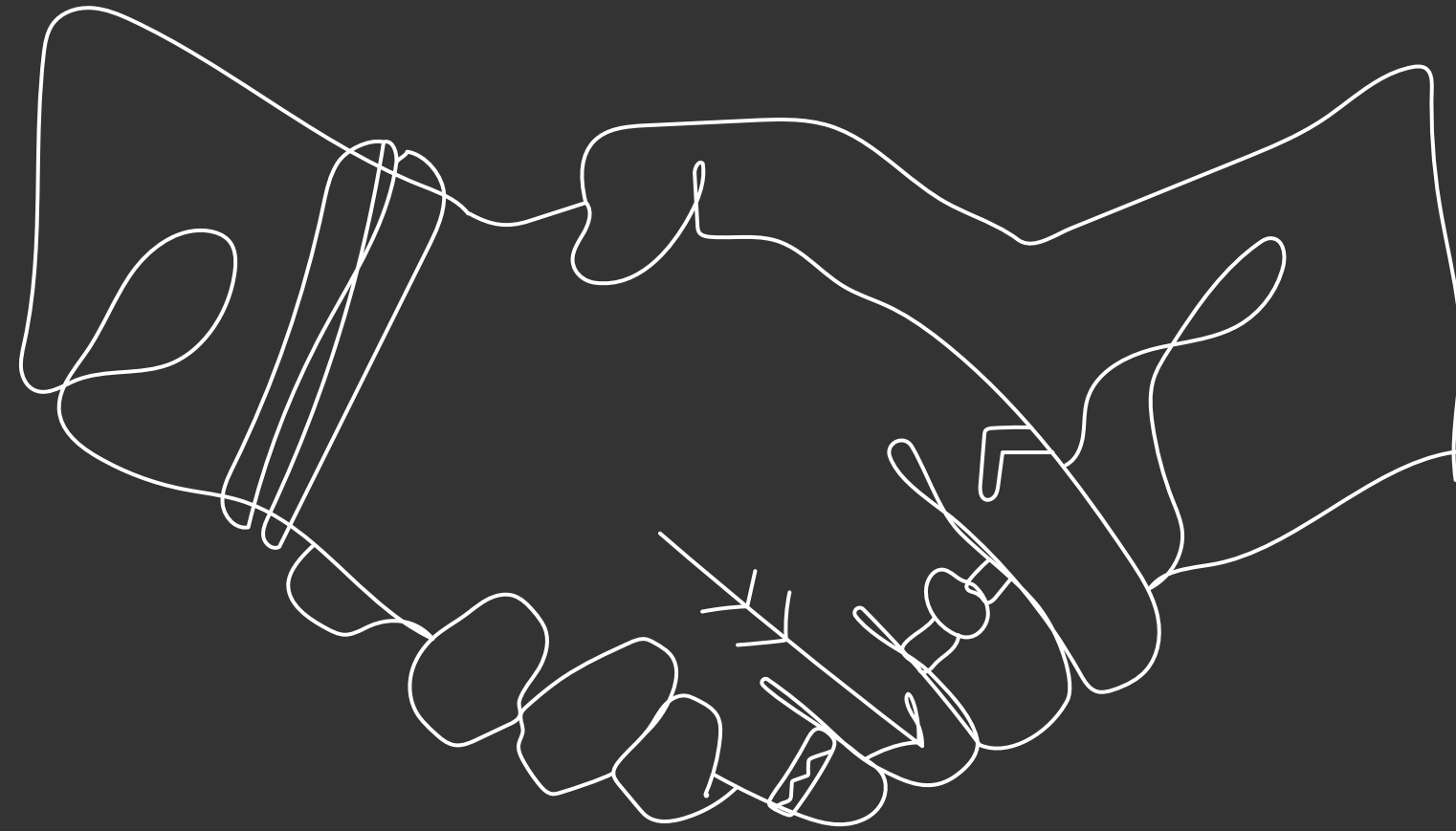

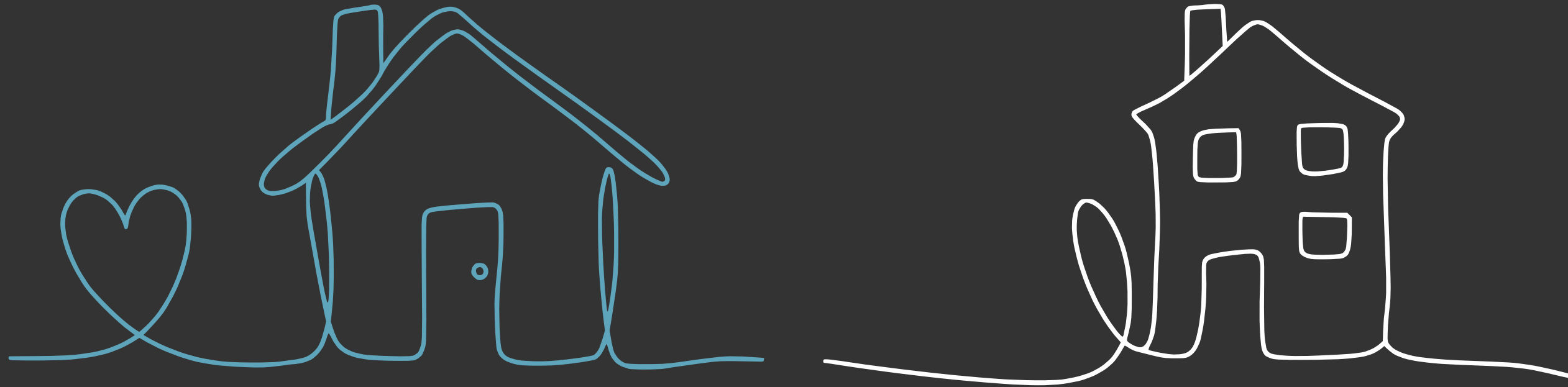

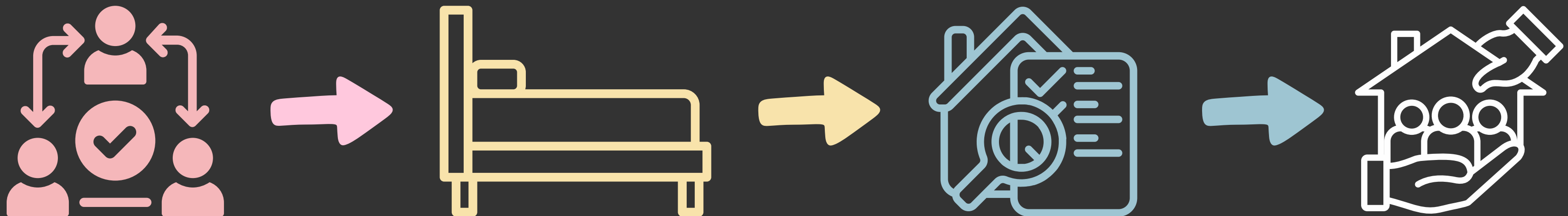
HOMELESS RESPONSE UPDATES

Beginning this quarter, we are adding *Homeless Response System Updates* as a recurring agenda item to help re-center our coalition meetings around the work of our local homeless response system. Our goal is to create a space where partners can:

- Share trends, successes, and emerging challenges.
- Identify system gaps and opportunities for collaboration.
- Highlight where community support is needed.
- Help coalition members better understand how our homeless response system works and how they can become involved.

OUR LOCAL SYSTEM

Today's updates are organized around the major components of our homeless response system: Coordinated Entry, Emergency Services & Shelter, Housing, Navigation, and Housing Placement.



COORDINATED ENTRY



Purpose: Coordinated Entry serves as the front door to our homeless response system by helping ensure households experiencing homelessness are identified, assessed, and quickly connected to services and housing interventions that best meet their needs.

Coordinated Entry Agencies:

- **Service-Based Entry:** Pathways Community Center + HMIS Service Providers (shelter programs)
- **Outreach-Based Entry:** Catawba Area Coalition for The Homeless (CACH)



EMERGENCY SERVICES & SHELTER

Purpose: Emergency shelters provide immediate safety and stability while helping households connect to longer-term housing opportunities. Our community relies on multiple providers, each serving different populations and operating under different models to safely shelter individuals & families until a permanent housing opportunity is identified.

Shelter Providers: These following slide displays shelter providers that regularly participate within our local homeless response system. This list is not intended to represent every emergency shelter or temporary housing resource available in our community.

HOUSING NAVIGATION

Purpose: Housing Navigation helps households identify permanent housing opportunities and overcome barriers to securing permanent housing. Housing navigation activities include:

- Landlord engagement
- Housing search trends
- Rental market conditions
- Barriers to placement
- New housing opportunities

HOUSING PLACEMENT

Purpose: Housing placement programs provide rental units, financial assistance, and/or supportive services to help households transition from homelessness into permanent housing units. These programs are specifically designed to serve individuals experiencing homelessness.

Permanent Housing Programs:

- CACH & HDC Rapid Reset Program
- CACH & HDC Rapid ReHousing Program
- Safe Passage Rapid ReHousing Program
- HDC Permanent Housing Rental Program

SERVICE GAPS & OPPORTUNITIES

Current Areas of Need:

- **Homelessness Prevention** — Resources that help households remain safely housed before they experience homelessness.
- **Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH)** — Long-term affordable housing paired with intensive supportive services for individuals and families with the highest service needs.

Looking Ahead: As our Homeless Response System Updates continue to evolve, we hope to expand these conversations to include additional partners, housing resources, and strategies that strengthen our community's response to homelessness.
